



# Training NT2-II exam



Do you want to prove your (future) boss that you master Dutch at a professional level?  
Get an official NT2 diploma!  
You can also use the NT2 diploma to attend lectures in Dutch, as (part of) your  
Inburgeringsexamen, or to obtain Dutch citizenship.

## NT2 exams

The NT2 exams are official Dutch state exams. NT2 stands for: *Nederlands als Tweede Taal* (= Dutch as a Second Language).

**NT2 Programma I** is at B1 level (Intermediate). It is aimed at non-native speakers who want to work or study at a medium level.

**NT2 Programma II** is Upper-Intermediate (B2 level). This is for non-native speakers who want to work in a job that requires a master's or bachelor's degree, or want to attend lectures in Dutch at a university or *hogeschool*.

The level of work or study is decisive for the choice of the NT2 exam. It is not recommended by the government to do both. Therefore, CSA-EUR offers training for Programma II.

The NT2 exams are not being held by CSA-EUR, but by a government-controlled organization. The exams can be taken almost daily in five Dutch cities. Rotterdam is one of them.

## The course

In the 1st trimester, the CSA-EUR course trains you for the NT2-II Listening & Speaking exams.

In the 2nd trimester, we focus on the Reading & Writing exams.

Both courses, September – November and January – March, consist of 10 sessions of 2 hours each.

- The courses offer extensive information about the NT2 exam in general and about the specific requirements for each module.
- You are trained intensively in the specific types of questions for each exam part.
- The grammar that is most important for the exams is reviewed in a condensed form.
- Extra attention is paid to vocabulary and topics that are of special significance in the exams.
- You will get lots of practical tips and tricks for each of the modules.

The lesson materials include a series of official sample exams from past years.

## Four exam certificates = 1 diploma

The NT2 exams contain four parts: Speaking, Writing, Listening and Reading. The four exams can be taken at the same time, or one by one, or two by two over a longer period.

The workload of preparing for all four exams simultaneously, besides your studies or job, is mostly too heavy. In practice, doing the exams two by two works best.

For each exam module, a partial certificate is issued. It remains valid indefinitely. After passing all four modules, the partial certificates can be exchanged for a full NT2 diploma.
